This Standard was prepared by the Joint Standards Australia/Standards New Zealand Committee WS/3, Sanitary Plumbing Fixtures, to supersede AS 1229—1991. It includes requirements for troughs and tubs made from concrete, pressed steel vitreous enamel, stainless steel, vitreous china, plastic and composite materials.

The object of this revision is to issue it as a Joint Australian/New Zealand Standard and incorporate amendments and additions arising from industry requirements.

The term 'normative' has been used in this Standard to define the application of the appendix to which it applies. A 'normative' appendix is an integral part of a Standard.
